

Docking Stations

You may find on some desk in the Observatory standard docking stations that can be used for any Windows, Mac or Linux based laptop, provided it has a USB-C connector. Our docking stations are connected to a keyboard, mouse, two screens, cabled internet and a power supply. You just have to connect your laptop using the available USB-C cable and boot it.





Setup screens

- Windows: you need to go to the settings -> Display where you can set your preferred screen orientations and layout.
- MacOS: you need to install the free package [DisplayLink Manager](#) once before you connect to the docking station
- Linux: normally your window manager has a Display menu item in which you can set the layout and orientation of the different screens.

Windows Access

To access our Remote Windows Desktop Servers you must use a program which can tunnel the Remote Desktop Protocol over ssh. For the different operating systems this is described:
